Course Description

Students will be introduced to principles and techniques of basic drawing using dry media with an emphasis on its formal language and working from direct observation. Students will become familiar with the tools of drawing and the proper use of each tool. Students will gain knowledge in how to interpret line, form, perspective, and scale. Students will learn through class the fundamentals of drawing technique. The first section of three classes will be revolved around this formal training as well as preparing a final project. The last three classes will be the completion of the final project as well as a discussion of the history of drawing. Students may choose to complete this final project on their own time.

Course goals and Objectives:

Gain knowledge of drawing tools, materials and techniques.

Understand elements of line, shape, value, space, texture and the principles of balance, rhythm, emphasis, scale/proportion, depth, contrast, movement and composition.

Develop the ability to draw from observation.

Learn to work in a communal studio environment.

Understand the formal language of drawing and the fundamentals of artistic expression.

Develop the ability to evaluate one's own work and the work of others.
